- \$100 Reservation Fee

- 2 Covered Charcoal Grills
- Water (Not potable; for cleaning only)
- Electricity



Shelter 2

- \$50 Reservation Fee
- For Up to 40 People
- 6 Picnic Tables in Large Shelter & 1 in Small Shelter
- 1 Charcoal Grill
- Water (Not potable; for cleaning only)
- Electricity



Shelter 3

- \$50 Reservation Fee
- For Up to 25 People
- 4 Picnic Tables in Large Shelter
- 1 Picnic Table in Small Shelter
- 1 Charcoal Grills
- Electricity



Shelter 4

- \$50 Reservation Fee
- For Up to 20 People
- 3 Picnic Tables - 2 Small Shelters, 1 in Open Area
- 2 Charcoal Grills
- Water (Not potable; for cleaning only)
- Electricity
- Closest to Parking, Playground, Restrooms

Park Hours:

May-October

Daily 8 a.m. to Dusk

November to April

Fri. 10 a.m. to Dusk

Sat. & Sun. 8 a.m. to Dusk



Directions

- Exit Col. Parkway at Queen's Lake, turn right. Turn on Lakeshead Dr. Approx. 1 mile to Park entrance.
- From Peninsula: Exit I-64 at Rt. 199 toward Jamestown. Take first exit at Rt. 143 W. At first traffic light, turn right on Penniman Rd., go 1 block; turn left on Hubbard Ln. After Col. Pkwy overpass, turn right on Lakeshead Dr. Approx. 1 mile to Park entrance.

The park closes when weather conditions are severe or adverse to outdoor activity.

Facilities:

Park facilities are available on a first come, first served basis. Four picnic shelters can be reserved for group use for a minimal fee.

Dogs:

Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Owners must pick up and dispose of waste.

Vehicles:

Vehicles are restricted to paved roadways and parking areas. Off road driving is prohibited.

Fires:

All fires must be contained in the campfire circle or cooking grills near shelters. Fires must not be left unattended and should be completely extinguished before leaving the park.

Fishing:

Individuals must possess a valid Virginia fishing license in order to fish.

Canoeing & Kayaking:

Non-motorized boated is permitted. Boaters must use lifejackets.

Prohibited Activities:

Swimming, possession of alcoholic beverages, golfing, horseback riding, flying radio or wire controlled airplanes, overnight camping, and metal detectors.
