**Election of Officers for 2016**

Mr. Ted Moreland nominated Ms. Nancy Carter for Chair. Mr. Rich Thompson nominated Ms. Katherine Preston for Chair. Ms. Carter withdrew her name for consideration for Chair. The nomination of Ms. Preston as Chair was approved unanimously by the committee. Ms. Elaine Cardwell nominated Mr. Patrick Johnson for Vice-Chair. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Ted Moreland and was approved unanimously by the Committee.

**Approval of Minutes**

On a motion by Ms. Carter, duly seconded by Mr. Moreland, the October 26, 2015 meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

**Public Comment Period**

**VDOT Issues**

The following concerns were noted by members:

- Lack of maintenance on bike lanes and shoulders,
- Potholes on Longhill Road and Mooretown Road,
- Poor condition of Rochambeau Road,
- Sand and debris on the Capital Trail at Greensprings Road,
- Sand and debris at the intersection of Centerville Road and Brickbat Road,
- Bike lane crossing needed at Route 199 and Brookwood,
- Better signage needed for cyclists at the 7-11 connector at Jamestown Road.

## **Bikeway Projects Status Report**

York County

Ms. Amy Parker gave an update on the planned Cook Road bike lane.

Williamsburg

Mr. Rod Rhodes noted that Mr. Reed Nester would provide an update to the group during his presentation.

James City County

Mr. Jose Ribeiro noted that the new plan for the intersection of Monticello Avenue and News Road no longer includes a roundabout. The intersection will be signalized.

## **Old Business**

After discussion by the members on the Bicycle Priority Project List, Mr. Mooreland made a motion to accept the latest priority list. The motion was seconded by Mr. Don Cherry and approved unanimously by the Committee.

## **New Business**

Mr. Nester provided an update to the committee on bicycle infrastructure improvements in the City. The update included:

- New bike lanes on Jamestown Road,
- Public bike rack installations downtown and at City Parks,
- Bike grant program,
- Proposed improvements along Richmond Road (bike lanes and sharrows),
- Bike Share Program included in the CIP.

Mr. Nester was thanked for years of service and for improving the bicycle infrastructure in the region.

## **Other Business**

Mr. Allen Turnbull noted that there would be a Bike Month Proclamation Ride, from Richmond to Williamsburg, on May 6<sup>th</sup>. A retirement ride for Mr. Nester would also be held on June 4<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Thompson stated that the W&M Bike Alliance's presentation in New Orleans was well received by other schools.

Ms. Carter noted that WAB would hold bike rides throughout May, including Pedal the Parkway on May 7<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Rhodes noted that the City along with WAB and Bike/Walk Williamsburg would host a luncheon on National Bike to Work Day, May 20<sup>th</sup>.
