## Who is the York County Beautification Committee?

The York County Beautification Committee (YCBC - originally called the York County Appearance Committee) was formally established on December 16, 1976, to “promote a cleaner, more attractive York County and increase awareness of environmental issues among York County citizens.” Since that time, members have worked tirelessly to conduct litter prevention, beautification, and environmental awareness programs in order to fulfill that purpose.

In April 2012, the Board of Supervisors, through the work of the YCBC, was presented with a Certificate of Affiliation with the national Keep America Beautiful organization (KAB). Keep America Beautiful, Inc., is a national non-profit organization that follows a practical approach utilizing citizens, businesses, and government to find solutions advancing the core issues of preventing litter, reducing waste, and beautifying communities. Affiliation with this program not only brings national recognition, but will enhance the existing efforts of the YCBC, as well as provide access to educational materials and grant funding to conduct related programs.

### Stormwater Medallions

The storm drain medallion program helps to bring awareness of the storm water system and what we can do to help keep the waterways clean. As stormwater runoff occurs, it flows over lawns, sidewalks, driveways, and streets, picking up pet waste, trash, oil, and fertilizers, eventually carrying them into the storm drains. These contaminants flow directly into the nearest creek, stream, or river, causing an excessive amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, bacteria, and sediment in the waterways, resulting in algae blooms, reduced dissolved oxygen, and land and stream bank erosion. The effect of these now unlivable environments is a reduced oyster population, fish kills, and cloudy water.

Each individual can help make sure that stormwater is safe and as clean as possible to reenter the waterways, by picking up pet waste, sweeping up anything that is lying on the pavement, cleaning up oil in driveways, and not over-fertilizing gardens or lawns. The more people in our community who are aware of our stormwater system, the more we can do to improve the water quality of Hampton Roads and the Chesapeake Bay waterways.

The storm drain medallions serve as reminders of where the stormwater goes when it reaches the stormwater system. The installation is quick and easy as they are simply placed on the drain with an adhesive and held in place one to two minutes with some pressure. There are thousands of storm drains that need to be marked, and by placing the storm drain medallions, we can educate to keep the waterways clean. ## Household Chemical Disposal and Electronics Recycling

The Household Chemical Disposal Program operated by the Virginia Peninsula Public Service Authority (VPPSA) provides residents of member communities the opportunity to safely dispose of a variety of household chemicals. York County chemical collection events are held from 8am—noon on the second Saturday of March, May, July, September, and November. On these dates, residents of any VPPSA member community may bring accepted material to the Public Works complex located at 105 Service Drive, just past the Waste Management Center on Goodwin Neck Road. This service is available to residents only—no businesses please.

Acceptable materials include lawn and garden products, household maintenance products, household batteries, automotive chemicals, household cleaners, CFL light bulbs, and fluorescent light tubes. Items that are not accepted include business or medical waste, compressed gas cylinders, explosives, ammunition or gun powder, shock sensitive materials, radioactive materials, and household trash.

Residents can also recycle a variety of household electronic items. This includes computers, monitors, fax machines, small copiers, printers, and other small household electronic devices such as toaster ovens and other small appliances. *Televisions are generally not included.* This service is available to residents only—no businesses please.

### Stay Prepared for Flooding

Flooding is the most frequent severe weather threat and the costliest natural disaster facing the nation. To prepare for a flood you can do the following:

- Know your flood hazard and flood risks for your property. Visit the county website at [www.yorkcounty.gov](http://www.yorkcounty.gov) or call Public Works at (757) 890-3752 to find out if you are located in a flood zone. Floods are the number one natural disaster in the United States.
- Insure your property. Most homeowners insurance does not cover flood damage.
- Protect yourself and your family from flood hazards. Build an emergency supply kit. Designate a place where your family can meet if an evacuation order is issued. Visit [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov) for a supply checklist.
- Protect yourself and property from flood hazards. Elevate your home and electrical / mechanical equipment above the flood level. Keep debris and trash out of the streams and ditches.
- Build responsibly – Obtain a building permit before you build and be informed on all flood related requirements.
- Protect natural floodplain functions. Do not dump fill or trash in the wetlands and don't dump pollutants down the storm drains.

### Market Days at the River

Yorktown “Market Days at the River” is now in its tenth season at Riverwalk Landing in historic Yorktown. Located on the banks of the York River between Buckner and Ballard Streets, the market operates weekly from 9am—1pm on Saturdays mid-May through the end of September, and continues in the fall on select Saturdays: Oct. 8, Nov. 12, and Dec. 10, from 9am—3pm. The market hosts more than 35 local farmers, vendors, and artists throughout the season with a variety of homegrown favorites and art.

The market is free to attend and features fresh produce, meat, and seafood, baked goods, gourmet herbs, cut flowers, potted plants, cheeses, handmade soaps and candles, live musical entertainment, and quality art. Throughout the summer, the market will feature a variety of entertainment and artists. In addition to the locally-grown, fresh picked produce and arts and crafts items available at Yorktown Market Days, shoppers also can enjoy the added bonus of being able to watch chefs demonstrate the preparation of various dishes using items fresh from the market on select Saturdays.

Green efforts include providing reusable (cloth) shopping bags for customers to avoid the use of plastic bags as much as possible. The use of Styrofoam is not permitted.

Free parking is available in several public parking areas within walking distance or an easy trolley ride.

## Hurricane Season is June - November

Many years can go by without a major storm affecting our area, making it easy to forget the potential impacts from such an event. We should, however, always be prepared for what can happen.

### Before the Storm:

- Keep your yard free of loose items such as lawn furniture, outdoor decorations, trash cans, etc., which can become dangerous projectiles.
- Keep trees and shrubbery trimmed. Make trees more wind resistant by removing diseased or damaged limbs, then strategically remove branches so that wind can blow through healthy limbs.
- Clear and secure loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts. Providing clear drainage will help prevent misdirected flooding.
- Keep on hand any items needed to board up windows and protect your home.
- If your home is prone to flooding, follow flood preparedness precautions.

### After the Storm:

- Set out debris for collection in separate piles for vegetative debris, construction/housing debris, and white goods or other metals.
- Place materials in a safe place and not near mailboxes, fire hydrants, power lines, ditches, manhole covers, water meters, or invisible fencing.
- Be patient, please! It may take a while for debris removal crews to make it through your area.

## Mosquito Problems Start at Home

The mosquito season comes alive in the summer. If they have not already, they will soon begin to fill the air and become a nuisance for many, not to mention a potential health threat if uncontrolled. Just one bite from a mosquito carrying an infectious disease such as West Nile Virus or Eastern Equine Encephalitis can be seriously debilitating or fatal. Mosquitoes, if infected, can transmit heart worms which can be fatal to dogs and cats.

York County has many acres of woodland and salt marsh mosquito breeding sites. It is important to remember that mosquitoes need standing water in which to reproduce. As little as a half-inch of water in a backyard container can produce dozens of mosquitoes.

Here are a few simple things that citizens can do for prevention and protection:

- Turn over wading pools, small boats, wheelbarrows, buckets, toys, and wagons.
- Shake out tarps that cover grills, firewood, boats, swimming pools, and yard equipment at least once a week.
- Keep garbage cans and recycling containers closed.
- Drain or treat unused swimming pools.
- Wear long, loose, and light colored clothing and use a spray repellent.

## Curbside Collections for Garbage and Recycling

York County provides curbside collection service for garbage and recycling on a voluntary basis for those residents who choose to subscribe.

“Basic Service” for curbside collections of garbage and recycling provides one 96-gallon cart for weekly garbage collection and one 96-, 65-, or 35-gallon cart for every other week collection of recycling materials. The cost for this service is \$17.50 per month. Subscribers are billed every-other-month as part of their Hampton Roads Utility Bill.

Additional levels of service are available to include long lane, backdoor or front porch service for elderly or infirm, as well as additional containers. Please visit [www.yorkcounty.gov/wastemanagement](http://www.yorkcounty.gov/wastemanagement) for information on available options.

### Yard Debris Disposal Options

York residents can schedule a yard debris collection for items such as limbs, branches, and bags of natural yard waste. Limbs should be no larger than 8” in diameter and 10’ in length. Residents who subscribe to basic collection service for garbage and recycling can schedule a pickup at a rate of \$25 per collection. Citizens who are not subscribed to the County’s solid waste collection service can schedule a pickup for \$75. Both subscribers and non-subscribers are limited to two collections every thirty days per household at the above rates. Additional pickups within a thirty-day period of the initial collection are scheduled at a rate of \$100 per collection.

Individuals may also bring material to the VPPSA Compost Facility located behind the Waste Management Center at 145 Goodwin Neck Road. VPPSA will accept residential and commercial yard debris deliveries containing material up to 24” in diameter and 10’ in length. There is no charge for subscribers to the county’s curbside solid waste collection program. Non-subscribers and commercial deliveries are charged \$38 per ton/prorated to a minimum charge of \$7. Hours of operation are Monday through Saturday, 8am—4pm. For more information about the Composting Facility, please call VPPSA at (757) 259-9850.

### Adopt-A-Spot Volunteer Program

York County encourages groups and individuals to play active and ongoing roles in beautifying, cleaning, and maintaining York County's public spaces, including creeks and storm drains. Adopt-A-Spot activities might include removing litter, graffiti, or weeds, maintaining a storm drain, or other forms of general upkeep. In certain locations, special landscaping features such as grass, plants, and flowers may even be added if they meet with Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and/or property owner specifications. Similar to the popular "Adopt-A-Highway" program sponsored by VDOT, organizations and individuals receive public recognition of their work through the prominent display of a sign "on the spot."

### How does Adopt-A-Spot Work?

Any local community organization, business, or individual (18 years or older) is allowed to Adopt-A-Spot. Adopt-A-Spot volunteers commit to adopt their spot for a minimum of one year and agree to conduct quarterly cleanups of their proposed location. Other beautification elements such as the planting and maintenance of shrubbery or flowers may also be added, pending approval by the appropriate county agencies or property owners. The County will provide cleanup materials (bags, orange safety vests, etc.). In addition, the County waives any fees that may be incurred for the disposal of garbage and recyclables at the York County Waste Management Center, provided the above listed information has been given at least one week prior to the cleanup.

## Leaf Collection Program Overview

Leaves are generally collected during the months of November through January. During this time, York County residents who reside on publicly maintained streets or roads can place an unlimited number of clear bags of leaves at the front roadside for collection every other week.

Residents who live in private communities or on privately maintained streets or roads may bring leaves to the closest public roadway for collection. In addition, ALL RESIDENTS may bring leaves year-round to the VPPSA Compost Facility located at 145 Goodwin Neck Road, Monday through Saturday, 8am—4pm

For leaf collection purposes, the county is divided into two zones:

The *Northern Zone* includes all homes on and north of Dare Road, including neighborhoods along Wolf Trap Road, Goodwin Neck Road, and homes in and near Marlbank, Edgehill, Queens Lake, Hubbard's Lane, Skimino and Lightfoot. The *Southern Zone* includes all homes south of Dare Road, including neighborhoods in Grafton, Tabb, Brandywine, Coventry, Kiln Creek, Calthrop Neck, Running Man and Cary's Chapel Road area.

Leaves must be in **clear bags (no drawstrings, please!)** and bags must be easy to handle by one person (max. weight limit = 40 pounds). Clear bags can be purchased at local hardware, grocery, and department stores.

Bags must be at the front roadside by 7am on the Monday of your collection week. Pick up will be completed by the end of the week. For additional information or to see the leaf collection schedule for 2016, please click "Leaf Collection" at [www.yorkcounty.gov/pw](http://www.yorkcounty.gov/pw).
