The feature film is “Pride and Prejudice” directed by Joe Wright and starring Keira Knightley. Based on Jane Austen’s novel by the same name, the movie is rated PG and runtime is 129 minutes. A brief discussion will follow the movie if time permits. The novel is available on the library’s Web site, www.yorkcounty.gov/library for your reading pleasure. Registration is not required.
