A public hearing will be held on Thursday, April 24, at 7 p.m. in York Hall to gather public comment regarding the proposed budget. If you are unable to attend and

Board of Supervisors Actions

November 19, 2013

- Authorized miniature golf, batting cages, and a golf driving range at 301 Lightfoot Road.
- Authorized major modifications to the design and layout of an existing retail center (The Marquis) and authorized the establishment of a gas station located at 300 Whittakers Trace within the project.
- Authorized with revisions the reclassification of 100.7 acres of land located at 900 Marquis Parkway on the east side of Interstate 64 south of the Route 199 (Marquis Center Parkway) interchange from EO-Economic Opportunity to PD-Planned Development.
- Approved an amendment to the York County Code relating to prohibited plainly audible noise.
- Accepted and appropriated \$61,931 in US Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration funds to be used for overtime payments and one Administrative Assistant for the Norfolk Resident Office Task Force.

December 3, 2013

- Authorized procurement arrangements for Old Wormley Creek Lift Station #23 and Real Estate Assessment software.

December 17, 2013

- Approved modifications to the requirement that The Reserve at Williamsburg planned development to eliminate the age-restricted senior housing requirement for the undeveloped portions of the project.
- Added the Sherwood Forest subdivision to the list of specific areas where parking of certain classifications of commercial, recreational, and passenger carrying vehicles on public streets is prohibited. (See related article on page 8.)

January 7, 2014

- Elected Donald E. Wiggins as Chairman and Thomas G. Shepperd as Vice Chairman for 2014. The Board will continue to meet the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 6 p.m. in York Hall. There will be no first Tuesday meeting in July and November.

February 4, 2014

- Authorized a commercial stable located at 201 Hansford Lane.
- Tabled a proposed amendment to include "Places of Worship" as a land use which may utilize electronic changeable message or image signs for which the message or image may change as frequently as every eight seconds.
- Endorsed the findings and recommendations of the Virginia Department of Transportation concerning a 4-Way Stop traffic control configuration at the intersection of Dare Road, Lakeside Drive, and Railway Road.
- Approved the acquisition of five parcels of property on Dare Road for a replacement fire station.


York County CERT Training Program

Voter Registration Information

This fall, York County voters will cast votes for a member of the **U.S. Senate and a member of the U.S. House of Representatives**. Any **primaries for Republican or Democratic nominations** for these offices will be held on **June 10**. If a primary is held, the polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Any qualified resident of Virginia may apply for voter registration or update his or her registration information at the Registrar's Office, the Yorktown or Tabb libraries, or the Griffin-Yeates Center. Voter registration applications are also available on the Registrar's website, www.yorkcounty.gov/voting. Qualified residents who will be 18 years of age on or before November 4 may register and vote in the June 10 primary.

The deadline to register to vote, or to make changes to your voter registration information prior to the primary, is Monday, May 19. If you mail your application, it must be postmarked no later than Monday, May 19. If the application is delivered in person, by you or a family member/friend, it must be received in the office by May 19.

A partnership between the State Board of Elections and the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles now allows most Virginia residents to apply to register to vote, or update their registration information, online. Residents can take advantage of this service by visiting www.vote.virginia.gov.

Did you know that you are able to check your registration status online? Visit www.yorkcounty.gov/

voting and select "Verify Your Voter Registration Here." You will be able to check your registration status AND find out where you go to cast your vote.

If you need to obtain an **absentee ballot**, you must complete an absentee ballot application and return it to the Registrar's Office. The deadline for an absentee ballot to be delivered by mail is Tuesday, June 3, at 5 p.m. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot in person is Saturday, June 7, at 5 p.m. The Registrar's Office will be open on Saturday, June 7, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to accommodate in-person absentee voters.

FY15 Operating Budget Update

The York County School Division is in the process of developing the FY15 Operating Budget. Over the last five years, our schools have experienced historic reductions in state aid. As a result, the division has had to eliminate 143 positions, reduce instructional and operational spending, and implement new fees for students. YCSD spends significantly fewer dollars per students than our eight nearby comparator divisions, despite the fact that the state rates York County as having a relatively high ability to fund K-12 education.

While student achievement generally remains high, data indicates some areas of concern relating to our students'

performance. In order to sustain and build upon the excellence our community has come to expect from our schools, it is important that FY15 Operating Budget address some of the deficits that have occurred in previous years.

The Superintendent's preliminary recommendations for next year's budget includes reductions of more than \$1.5 million, including savings relating to electricity, health insurance and decreased compensation due to staff turnover. The preliminary recommendations also include more than \$2.4 million to address rising student enrollment and to meet federal and state requirements relating to the Virginia Retirement System and serving

students with special needs. Other preliminary recommendations include funding to improve the teacher salary scale, which has been frozen for multiple years, as well as partially restoring funding for textbooks and critical technology infrastructure.

On March 11, York County Fire and Life Safety and the Commonwealth of Virginia, in conjunction with the National Weather Service, will conduct a statewide tornado drill so that schools, businesses and families can practice their tornado emergency plans.

Nominations due February 26 for 2014 Outstanding Youth Award Scholarships

Citizens are invited to help celebrate some of the good news about our high school aged youth by nominating a deserving student for one of the county's four \$500 Outstanding Youth Award Scholarships sponsored each year by the Board of Supervisors and the Youth Commission. The due date for nominations in the four categories of Compassion, Courage, Community Service and Overall Achievement has been extended to Wednesday, February 26.

Nominees must be residents of York County and enrolled in grades 9-12 in public, private, or homeschool. A selection committee will review the nominations and choose an award recipient for each category. The four award recipients will each receive an educational scholarship and be formally recognized with their families and nominators at a reception in their honor and at a Board of Supervisors meeting in May. The Supervisors will send a letter and signed certificate to all nominees congratulating them on their nomination.

Applications due March 5 for 2014-2015 Youth Commission

The York County Board of Supervisors is currently seeking students who are interested in representing youth interests and concerns by serving on the York County Youth Commission for the 2014-2015 school year. Applicants must be York County residents who are currently enrolled in grades 8-11 in either public, private or homeschool.

The Youth Commission's primary purpose is to serve as a link between the Board and the county's youth by representing youth-related needs and issues. In addition, Commission members typically participate in rewarding community service projects, learn about county government, develop leadership and teambuilding skills, and sponsor county-wide high school social events.

On-Street Parking Restrictions

Since the initial adoption in 2002, the list of county subdivisions whose streets are covered by the parking restrictions applicable to large commercial, recreational and passenger-carrying vehicles has grown as additional neighborhoods/subdivisions have requested to be included.

These restrictions prohibit the parking of any of the following types of vehicles on the public streets within the designated community:

Commercial Vehicles

- Greater than 10,000 lbs. gross weight, or
- Greater than 21 feet in length
- Any HazMat vehicle
- Heavy construction equipment
- Tractor truck, trailer, dump truck, concrete mixer, towing vehicle, beverage/food truck or trailer

Passenger Carrying Vehicles

- 16 passenger or more or
- Licensed as a common or contract carrier or
- Licensed as a limousine


Recreational Vehicles

- Gross weight greater than 10,000 lbs. or
- Greater than 21 feet in length

Neighborhoods where these restrictions are in place can be found at www.yorkcounty.gov, select "Online Services," and then "County Code" (perform a search for "Parking of certain classifications of vehicles in certain designated areas"). All streets within the listed areas are subject to the restrictions.

Suspected violation of these restrictions can be reported to the Sheriff's Office. Violations are considered to be traffic infractions punishable by a fine of not more than \$200.

Requests from property owner associations or groups of residents to have additional subdivisions covered by the restrictions should be directed to the County Administrator's office by calling 890-3320 or emailing ctyadm@yorkcounty.gov.



"Help for the Homeless" Awareness Event February 28

A York County community-wide "Help for the Homeless" event is scheduled for York High School's Bailey Field on Friday, February 28, from 6 to 9 p.m. This event is open to families and students of all ages. All attendees will be able to learn more about the plight of the homeless and be given the opportunity to help those in need. Admission is free, but donations are encouraged and will be used to help support programs providing direct assistance to homeless individuals in our area.

Activities scheduled for the evening include homelessness "fact poster" displays, panel discussion with individuals who have been homeless and those who work with the homeless, group sharing and discussion, a "Shine Your Light for the Homeless" support walk with glow sticks (available for a small donation), and more.

Monetary donations will be accepted and churches, service organizations, neighborhood organizations, families and individuals are encouraged to collect funds ahead of

time and bring them to the event. Collect your spare change in the two weeks prior to the event - a little goes a long way! Consider skipping lunch one day and donating the money you would normally spend on that meal. All donations will be distributed to local support organizations. A list of all recipient homelessness support groups will be announced at the event.

Placement/removal of trash carts; Weather delays

Residents who subscribe to the county's curbside collection program for garbage and recycling are reminded that the York County Code establishes the following requirements concerning placement and removal of trash and recycling carts at the roadside:

- Trash and recycling carts shall be placed at the curb ready for collection prior to 7 a.m. on the day scheduled for their collection but not more than 12 hours before that time.
- Carts shall be removed from the roadside no later than midnight of the day of collection.

Residents who will be away from home on vacation or business should ensure that they make the necessary arrangements with reliable friends or neighbors to have the trash carts placed and/or removed from the roadside in accordance with the above schedule prior to departing.


Compliance with these basic requirements will contribute considerably to the aesthetics of neighborhoods and enhance the quality of life that residents of York County have come to appreciate and expect.

For more information about the county's trash and recycling collection programs, visit www.yorkcounty.gov/wastemanagement or call 890-3780. The website contains information about curbside collection as well as citizen drop-offs at the Transfer Station, special collections (household chemical, electronics), and more.

In case of inclement weather that cancels collections, trash collection will be delayed for the number of days it is impacted, up to a maximum of two days (ex: a missed Tuesday would be collected on Wednesday; however a missed Tuesday and Wednesday would be collected Thursday and Friday, respectively, with the last collection of the week performed on Sunday). Makeup recycling collection would be determined based on the situation. For updated information about changes to the collection schedule, citizens should access the York County website at www.yorkcounty.gov, monitor the county's cable channel (Cox channel 46 and Verizon channel 38), or call 890-3780. Citizens are encouraged to subscribe to our email notification system located at www.yorkcounty.gov (select "Subscribe to Notifications" on the left side under "How Do I?").

Proposed Rezoning have land use implications

Last September the Board of Supervisors adopted an updated Comprehensive Plan for the county. This was the culmination of a 19-month review process involving 18 public meetings and work sessions, including six public information and input sessions - four joint community forums conducted with James City County and Williamsburg and two public meetings focusing specifically



on York County. The product of this effort, *Charting the Course to 2035: The County of York Comprehensive Plan*, is the long-range plan for the physical development of the county. The land use designations established by the Plan set the broad policies on which specific zoning decisions are based.

As the first step in implementing the updated Plan, the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors will

be considering a series of potential amendments to the Zoning Map in five areas of the county where the land use designations in the Plan have changed. Most of the proposed changes do not represent changes in policy but rather are intended to recognize changes in land use that have occurred since the previous Plan update in 2005. Significant acreage has been converted to conservation use in the last eight years with the recordation of conservation easements by the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and the acquisition of land for conservation purposes by Newport News Waterworks and The Nature Conservancy. These

properties have been redesignated Conservation in the updated Comprehensive Plan and are now proposed to be rezoned to RC (Resource Conservation).

In two cases the proposed rezonings have land use policy implications. One of these is in the area of Newport News-Williamsburg International Airport, where two landlocked parcels at the end of the runway that are owned by the airport are proposed to be rezoned from RC to IL (Limited Industrial) to recognize the possible future expansion of the airport runway. Airports are not a permitted use in the RC zoning district, but are permitted with a Special Use Permit in the IL district.

The second area consists of 12 parcels with a combined area of 27 acres on the south side of Back Creek Road across from the HRSD treatment plant. Six of these parcels are occupied by single-family detached homes, and six are undeveloped. This small residential area abuts over 600 acres of land that was donated by BP Amoco to The Nature Conservancy in 2007 for conservation purposes. These twelve properties have been changed from General Industrial (IG) to Low Density Residential in the updated Plan and are proposed to be rezoned from IG to Rural Residential.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on the proposed rezonings at its February 12 meeting. After the Planning Commission has made its recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, the proposed changes will go to the Board for another public hearing and final action. 2014 Mosquito Season soon will be upon us



Volunteers are needed in the **Mosquito Monitor program** to help fight the bite! No previous experience is required. Volunteers will be trained and provided with a light trap for monitoring the mosquitoes. As a volunteer mosquito monitor, you will play an important role in reporting mosquito counts which will directly affect the ground and/or aerial spraying schedule.

This one-of-a-kind program has won national recognition as being unique in playing an important role in the mosquito control effort.

To volunteer, call 890-3791 no later than Friday, March 28. You can also submit volunteer information to elizabeth.hodson@yorkcounty.gov. Volunteers will be notified of the scheduled two-hour training in mid-April. Let's all be mosquito beaters in our prevention efforts!

Biological control "mosquito dunks" and mosquito fish are available to citizens for use in standing water such as unused swimming pools or ornamental ponds. The dunks are being offered again this season as long as limited supplies last. One two-dunk pack is available per household and must be picked up by the homeowner. Stop by the Waste Management Center at 145 Goodwin Neck Road, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Additional mosquito dunks may be purchased at local

hardware stores, garden centers, and home improvement stores. Free mosquito fish can be obtained by calling 890-3791 or via email (at left). Leave your name, address, and telephone number along with the size of your unused swimming pool or backyard ornamental pond. Fish deliveries will not be made until June to mid-July and residents will be notified several days prior to the delivery date.

Mosquito season usually begins in mid-May. The start of the season depends on the amount of rain we receive this spring, the amount of standing water, and the water's temperature in the woodland areas. The **mosquito spray hotline** will be activated on Monday, May 19. Information also will be available on the mosquito control website - www.yorkcounty.gov/mosquito - which will provide daily information on where and when spraying is to be conducted (if needed and as weather conditions permit).

To report a mosquito concern, call 890-3790 or use the email address provided and give your name, address, and telephone number. If you do not want your property ground-sprayed, call 890-3791 or contact us via email. A spray avoidance request form will then be sent for you to sign. Also, this request can be submitted via our website. This needs to be done every year to update our list as citizens relocate or situations change.

Personal Property Tax information

If you have recently moved to York County or have recently purchased a new or replacement vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, boat or watercraft, you need to register your property with the Commissioner of the Revenue by providing the title, state registration, or bill of sale. After the vehicle has been registered with the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles or the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, no additional returns will be required unless there is a change in residency or ownership status.

If you sell or trade a vehicle, please notify the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles and the Commissioner of the Revenue immediately to update records and make tax adjustments (if applicable).

All motor vehicles, trailers, semi-trailers, boats or

watercraft that have no change in residency or ownership will be assessed based on prior year information. Contact the Commissioner of the Revenue to report any change that will affect your tax bill.

Annual filing of Tax Return of Tangible Personal Property for Manufactured (Mobile) Homes must be made on or before **March 3** to avoid a 10% penalty (\$10 minimum, not to exceed the amount of the tax).
