Clyde Marsteller, Virginia Master Naturalist with the Historic Rivers Chapter, will lead a Walk and Talk at New Quarter Park on Saturday, Nov. 7 from 10 a.m. until noon.

He will guide participants along the park's hiking trails to look for insects that live below the leaf litter and logs where they perform many beneficial functions in the natural world order.

Marsteller's "Zoo in a Suitcase" program has been a favorite activity in area elementary schools where he unpacks his collection of insects and worms for students to see and touch while he encourages them to understand their essential role as decomposers of organic materials.
