



Fireworks and Evening Activities for Yorktown Fourth of July Celebration

Yorktown, June 20—The 28th annual Yorktown Fourth of July fireworks display promises to light up the sky over the York River beginning at 9:15 p.m. The best viewing areas are along the Yorktown Waterfront from Riverwalk Landing to the Beach Picnic Area and at the Yorktown Victory Monument.

Visitors are urged to arrive in Yorktown no later than 6:30 p.m. for the fireworks show due to heavy traffic volumes which will ultimately cause Yorktown to reach its parking capacity and be closed. The only two means of access in and out of Yorktown will be from Cook Road and the Colonial Parkway.

Visitors arriving early for the fireworks show are encouraged to enjoy the following activities:

- 5 p.m. – Elvis Impersonation by Charles Dunn at Riverwalk Landing
- 5:30 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. - Music by “Slapwater” at Riverwalk Landing
- 7 p.m. – Performance by The Fifes and Drums of York Town at the Yorktown Victory Monument
- 8 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. – Patriotic Concert by the United States Air Force Heritage of America Band from Langley Air Force Base at the Victory Monument
- 9:15 p.m. – 28th Annual Fireworks Display over the York River
