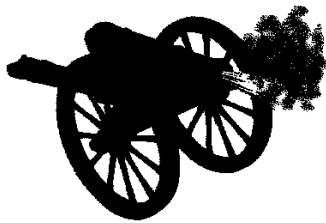
How did horses rescued from the enemy end up with Back-Country Virginia militia?

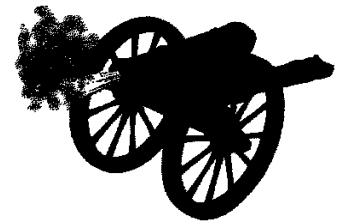
