

Welcome to New Quarter Park

This 545-acre York County park has opportunities to enjoy history, nature, recreation, and community.

HISTORY

Home to Native Americans for thousands of years, the area came under English control when it was granted to Robert Booth in 1642. Archaeology surveys have revealed historic dwellings built in the 17th and 18th centuries. After the Civil War, the area was unsettled but used by tenant farmers and the military.



NATURE

OUR PARK IS A NATURAL WONDER

Our park's forest has taken over 150 years to grow back. York County acquired the property in 1976 but did not open it for public use until 2005. Since then, hikers, birders, wildlife watchers, kayakers, and other recreation enthusiasts have discovered a mature forest with diverse habitats that support a wide variety of life.



RECREATION

ENJOY THE GREAT OUTDOORS

The park has hiking trails, bike trails, courts, and fields for basketball, volleyball, and horseshoes, plus a large playground area. New Quarter's renowned disc golf course hosts various seasonal PDGA tournaments. Access is available for kayaking and fishing on Queen's Creek. Check in the office for equipment. PARK REGULATIONS

Rules and regulations established in Chapter 17 of the Code of the County of York Public Areas Ordinance shall apply. Failure of individuals or groups to abide by these rules and regulations may result in denial of park use. Report violations to park staff or call York County Dispatch at 757-890-3621.

Trash: Dispose of trash in designated receptacles. Report trash-related problems to park staff.

Dogs: Must be on a leash at all times. Owners must clean up and dispose of waste.

Vehicles: Restricted to roadways and parking areas. Off-road driving is prohibited.

Fires: Shelter cooking grills must be attended to at all times, and fires completely extinguished.

Fishing: Virginia saltwater fishing license required.

Canoeing/Kayaking: Check in the park office and report how long you expect to be gone. Canoeing and kayaking are at your own risk and are permitted with a U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal flotation device.

Prohibited: Swimming, alcoholic beverages, balloons, golfing, horseback riding, motorized watercraft, drones, flying radio or wire-controlled airplanes, overnight camping, and metal detectors.

DIRECTIONS

From I-64:

Take exit 242A (Rt. 199 West/Jamestown.) Exit Rt. 199 at Rt. 143-W. Turn right. Follow Rt. 143 to Penniman Rd. (Magruder Elementary School on corner.) Turn right. Travel 1 block. Turn left on Hubbard Lane. Follow Hubbard for about one mile. After Colonial Parkway overpass, turn right on Lakeshead and follow to park.

From Colonial Parkway:

Exit at Queens Lake. Turn right. Turn onto Lakeshead and follow to New Quarter Park.


