




York County's population has grown steadily for over 80 years...



York County




...but the average annual increase has varied from decade to decade.






York experienced considerable growth from 2000 to 2010...






...almost two-thirds of it resulting from net migration...






... while Net Natural Increase has been fairly stable.






York County's population density is relatively low...






...but is 6th highest among the 95 counties in Virginia.






The median age is relatively high...






...and has been climbing for decades...






...with more and more seniors and fewer school-age children...






...though the percent of school-age children remains relatively high.






Households in the County are getting smaller, on average...






...but remain relatively large compared to neighbors.






...with relatively high proportions of married-couple families...






...and households with children.






The racial makeup of the population has been fairly stable over time...






...with less diversity than the metropolitan area or the state.





York County's population is well educated...






...with relatively high proportions of high school and college graduates...
