

Prevention and Community Safety

- Prevention/reduction of loss caused by fire, injury, illness and natural or man-made hazards
 - Public education
 - Code enforcement
 - Engineering of buildings/structures
- Inspections
- Investigation of fires of suspicious origin

Prevention and Community Safety

- Animal Services Bureau
 - Enforcement of Animal Control laws
 - Responds to animal threats and treatment issues
 - Promotes appropriate animal care and treatment



Emergency Management

- Coordination of a comprehensive risk-based program to protect the community from the effects of disasters or major emergencies such as hurricanes
- Emergency Operations Plan
- EOC Command and Control
- Disaster Sheltering, Human, Pet and Functional Needs

Fire and Life Safety Facts

- **Approximately 12,000 Fire Rescue response/incident activity annually**
- **Over 23,000 unit responses**
- **Average response time ~5.00 minutes**

Fire and Life Safety Facts

- **Highly competent cross-trained personnel—60% ALS/EMS**
- **Over 50,000 hours of training annually**
- **ISO rating of 2/2Y—top 2.5% in VA top 3% nationally**

Fire and Life Safety Facts

- Active grant process-in excess of \$2.3 million past 5 years
- Maintain numerous disaster plans over 2,800 pages
- Award winning organization
 - 2X Outstanding EMS Agency for Virginia
 - 2X Health and Safety Award for Virginia
 - Numerous individual awards-nationally, statewide, regionally and locally
 - Recently Virginia Outstanding EMS Agency
