
Digital Bytes from York County Public Library Helping you access our digital collections on your personal devices:

Governor Northam's [Executive Order Fifty-Five](#), announced and effective Monday, March 30, expands the closure of offices/facilities through June 10, 2020, unless amended or rescinded by a further executive order. According to a press release from the Governor's office, the order directs all Virginians to stay home except in extremely limited circumstances. Individuals may leave their residence for allowable travel, including to seek medical attention, work, care for family or household members, obtain goods and services like groceries, prescriptions, and others as outlined in [Executive Order Fifty-Three](#), and engage in outdoor activity with strict social distancing requirements.

- The Supreme Court of Virginia issued an Order EXTENDING the declaration of a Judicial Emergency in response to COVID-19 wherein it is ordered that Non-Essential, Non-Emergency court proceedings in all circuit and general district courts be in effect and continue beginning April 6 through April 26, 2020.  - The hope at this time is for the **Blues, Brews & BBQ Festival** scheduled for Saturday, May 2 to be moved to a later date *yet to be determined*.
 - All waterfront Yorktown Market Days have been cancelled through May 30, including the **Wellness Market** on May 9.
 - The **York County Historical Committee's Memorial Day Ceremony** scheduled for Monday, May 25 at York Hall will also not take place this year.
