Who can attend Safety Town?

Safety Town is for children who will be entering kindergarten this fall. They must be five years old by September 30, 2023.

What is the purpose of Safety Town?

Safety Town gives rising Kindergarten children and their parents important life safety information to help children avoid dangers and develop safe practices. Each day of the week features a different safety topic, including vehicle/pedestrian, fire, home and personal safety. Each topic, in turn, is divided into five enjoyable 20 minute interactive sessions that the children rotate through that day. A mini-town with traffic signs, roadways, and tricycles is set up indoors at the site for teaching traffic and pedestrian safety. Classroom rotations include guest speakers, real life props, and instructive puppet shows!

What types of lessons are taught?

Each morning, Safety Town will focus on a different safety topic. All lessons and activities relate to the topic of the day. The following is a list of the various safety topics and the daily activities:

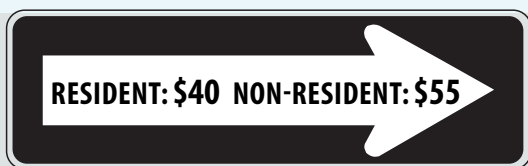
- Monday:** **Traffic Safety:** Seat Belt Safety, Pedestrian Safety, Sign Recognition, School Bus Safety, and Wheel Safety

- Tuesday:** **Fire Safety:** Get Out and Stay Out, Sparky's ABC's of Fire Safety, Matches and Lighters Are Tools Not Toys, and 9-1-1 How It's Done, Emergency Lights, and Pull to the Right.

- Wednesday:** **Home Safety:** Poisonous Plants, Disaster Preparedness, Common Household Poisons, Gun Safety, and Electrical Safety

- Thursday:** **Personal Safety:** Strange Animal Safety, Playground Safety, Tricky People Can't Fool Me, Good and Bad Germs, and Water Safety

- Friday:** **Completion Ceremony and Safety Fair**
