



Radiological Emergency Preparedness

Surry Nuclear Power Station – Emergency Planning Information

Portions of York County fall within the 10-mile Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ) of the Surry Nuclear Power Station. These areas are primarily located north and west of Fort Eustis Boulevard and include sections of the Lackey, Bruton, and Lightfoot communities.

Alert and Notification

If an emergency occurs at the Surry Nuclear Power Station, residents within the EPZ may be alerted through one or more of the following methods:

- **Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)** sent to mobile phones
- **Automated landline telephone notifications** (where available)
- **Emergency Alert System (EAS)** messages broadcast on local radio and television stations

What to Do if You Are Notified

If you receive an alert or notification regarding an emergency at the power station:


1. Remain calm.
2. Tune immediately to a local EAS radio or television station for official notification and instructions
3. Follow all guidance provided by public safety officials

Know Your Protective Action Zone (PAZ) and Evacuation Assembly Center (EAC)

The 10-mile EPZ around the Surry Power Station is divided into 30 distinct Protective Action Zones (PAZs). Knowing your PAZ is essential, it helps determine whether your area is affected during an emergency and what specific actions you should take.

- Not all zones will necessarily be affected during an incident. Listen carefully to instructions specific to your PAZ.
- If evacuation is ordered for your zone, you will be directed to report to your designated Evacuation Assembly Center (EAC).
- EACs provide contamination monitoring and, if recommended, Potassium Iodide (KI) to help protect your thyroid from radioactive iodine.

- Service animals and pets are permitted at EACs; other animals should be planned for in advance.
- To determine your PAZ, use the lookup tool on Dominion Energy’s preparedness site (for Surry Power Station). The tool is found by visiting the page “Know Your PAZ and EAC.”
