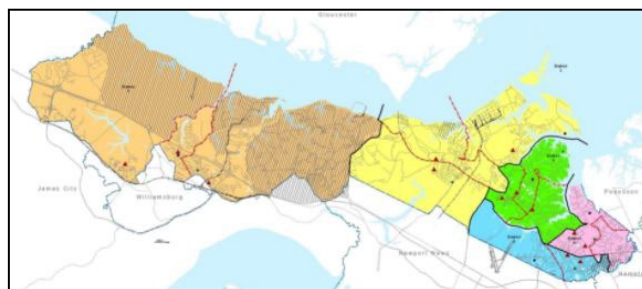

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Development Begins

The Board of Supervisors held a public forum at its January 18 meeting to gather input from citizens on their priorities for the upcoming budget. The County Administrator and staff are working to put together a proposed budget for the next fiscal year (July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023) and will present it at the March 15 Board meeting. Work sessions are being scheduled during which the Supervisors and staff will discuss various aspects of the proposal. The public is invited to address the Board during the April 19 Public Hearing. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for May 3. Riverwalk Statues Getting Spruced Up for Spring

Visitors to the waterfront in the next few weeks may notice something missing...the statues of Washington, Comte de Grasse, Lafayette, and Rochambeau are being removed temporarily for refurbishing and repainting. As the most recent addition to the installation, Rochambeau has not experienced the effects that weather can have on the materials used to make these statues, so he doesn't quite match the other three. Household Chemical Collection/Paper Shredding Events Begin in March

These popular drop-off events are 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. at 105 Service Drive. Residents may deliver a variety of **household chemicals** for proper and safe disposal. Among the chemicals collected are paints, gasoline, insecticides, bleach, and kerosene. The complete list is on our [Waste Management Center website](#). Free **paper shredding** services are available at all events to citizens who wish to dispose of personal papers. **Computers are also accepted** at these events along with monitors, cell phones, servers, and desktop printers. Additional York County events are held in May, July, September and November. However, all Household Chemical/Computer Recycling events are open to residents of York County, Williamsburg, James City County, Hampton, and Poquoson. So, if you miss one, check the schedule for the next! Note: The free paper shredding is offered by the County on our scheduled drop-off dates.
