Getting help preparing your taxes is available again this year.

Volunteers are providing this service for free to those who make an appointment at the Senior Center. Registering is easy: Visit the Senior Center on one of the following dates – January 26, 27, 28, or 31 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., pick up a tax packet, and schedule your appointment! Free Tax services begin February 1.

The Senior Center is located in the Washington Square Shopping Center on Route 17. Preference is given to those age 60 and up.
