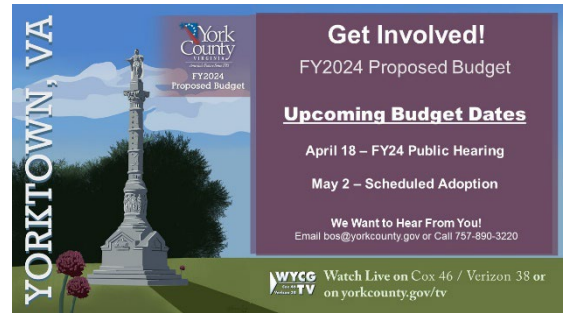

FY2024 Proposed Budget Available Online

At Tuesday’s Board of Supervisors’ meeting, County Administrator Neil Morgan presented the proposed budget for the next fiscal year. His presentation includes detailed information about projected revenues and expenditures, and also a helpful summary of the recommended reduction in real estate and personal property taxes.
