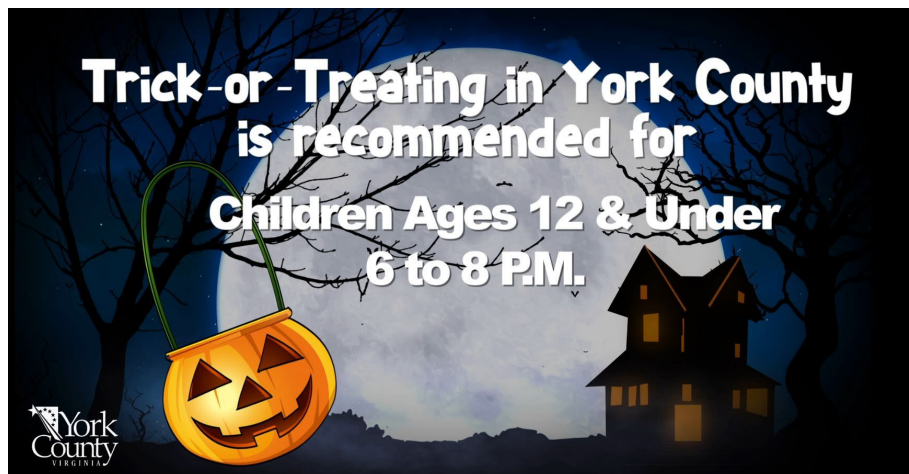


serve as role models who help supervise campers and provide for their safety and well-being.
