## Reminder: Leaf Collection Season Begins Monday

Residents in the leaf collection Southern Zone (all homes south of Dare Road) may be busy raking leaves this weekend and placing them by the roadside by 7 a.m. Monday (11/6), the first day of leaf collection. Residents in the Northern Zone (all homes on and north of Dare Road) have an extra week before their collections begin Monday, November 13. Collections repeat every other week through January. A final County-wide sweep will be completed January 29. An unlimited number of clear bags of leaves (no drawstrings, please) may be placed at the roadside on Monday of your collection weeks.
