## Registration is Now Open for Spring 2024 Fire and Life Safety Program


The Department of Fire and Life Safety is happy to announce the return of its Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training program. This popular citizen program gives participants the knowledge, skills, and abilities to better help themselves, their families, their neighborhood, and the community when York County is affected by major emergencies or disasters. Classes begin Tuesday, March 12 and are held in the Public Safety Building (301 Goodwin Neck Road). CERT requires a commitment of one evening a week for up to eight weeks of training from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m., as well as two Saturday mornings for a final training practice, final exercise, and graduation. Classes include presentations, discussions, and practical, hands-on experiences. Registration is free and open to residents, agencies, and those who work or worship in York County. ## Free Lecture on February 18: "Shipwrecked"



The public is invited to attend a free lecture presented by Christopher Newport University Professor Jonathan W. White, who will discuss the true story of swashbuckling sea captain Appleton Oaksmith and the murky, dangerous world of blockade-running and slave trading during the Civil War. The story comes from Professor White's newly released book "Shipwrecked" that can be purchased and signed at the event along with some of Professor White's 17 other books. The presentation begins at 2 p.m. and is held in York Hall (301 Main Street) in historic Yorktown. Stop by and learn more about the extraordinary measures the Lincoln Administration took to destroy the illegal transatlantic slave trade. No registration is required. ## Register by February 12 for the March 5 Presidential Primaries

Virginia Democratic and Republican Presidential Primaries will be held on Tuesday, March 5. Polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. The deadline to register to vote in the March 5 primaries, or to update your address or other registration information, is Monday, February 12. Most Virginia residents may register [online](#) instead of in-person. Early voting is already underway at both Registrar's locations (Washington Square Shopping Center and Victory Village Shopping Center), Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. These offices will also be open on Saturday, February 24, and Saturday, March 2, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist voters.
