The public has an opportunity to learn more about the proposed plans to rehabilitate and repair the existing Route 134 bridge that crosses over Route 17. The project information and plans are available in VDOT's Suffolk office (7511 Burbage Drive – 757-956-3269) and Williamsburg office (4451 Ironbound Road – 757-253-5138). The public is asked to



call in advance to ensure staff is available to discuss this project. If concerns are not satisfied, citizens may request that VDOT hold a public hearing.
