PROCLAMATION

CHESAPEAKE BAY DEADRISE DAY

JUNE 2, 2024

WHEREAS, the history and importance of the Chesapeake Bay Deadrise is especially crucial for the region as this purpose-built vessel is meticulously designed to effortlessly handle the rigors of the Chesapeake Bay, especially in rough waters, to provide stability for operating dredges, nets, and pots in shallow depths; and

WHEREAS, the Deadrise is crafted through the technique of cross-planking, which features bottom boards running perpendicular from the side of the boat, seamlessly converging at the keel's core; and

WHEREAS, the term originates from the vessel's design, beginning with an acute bow where the bottom boards are vertically aligned, gradually transitioning to a flatter profile towards the stern and over the boards located in the bow, referred to as the deadwood; and

WHEREAS, the boat, with its wooden hull, is distinguished by a sharp bow transforming into a flat V shape towards the stern, complemented by a compact cabin at the front and a spacious work area at the rear; and

WHEREAS, watermen and their boats play a crucial role in coastal communities by harvesting seafood and transporting fresh catches, sustaining local economies and providing access to essential food sources; and

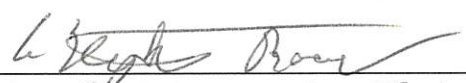
WHEREAS, the unmatched beauty and craftsmanship of this vessel stand as a testament to its exceptional quality and artistry; and

WHEREAS, the Chesapeake Bay Deadrise is recognized in the Code of Virginia Title 1, Chapter 5, Article 2 as the official designation of the Boat in the Commonwealth of Virginia;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the York County Board of Supervisors that June 2, 2024, be designated as Chesapeake Bay Deadrise Day in the County of York, Virginia.
