Dear Local Official:

The Department of Environmental Quality has received an application to withdraw groundwater in the Eastern Virginia Groundwater Management Area. Part V of the Groundwater Withdrawal Regulations requires that the Department of Environmental Quality send a notice of every draft permit to the board of each local governing body located within the groundwater management area where the proposed withdrawal will occur prior to the date of public notice.

In accordance with section 9VAC25-610-250 B, please find the attached notice that will be advertised in the *Virginian-Pilot* on May 17, 2024. The notice will be available on the DEQ website by the start of the Public Notice period. Additional information on the permit application may be obtained by contacting me.

## Public Notice -- Environmental Permit

**PURPOSE OF NOTICE:** To seek public comment on a draft permit from the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) for the withdrawal of ground water in Suffolk City, Virginia.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:** May 17, 2024 to June 17, 2024

**PERMIT NAME:** Ground Water Withdrawal Permit issued by DEQ pursuant to applicable water laws and regulations

**APPLICANT NAME, ADDRESS AND PERMIT NUMBER:** Hampton Roads Sanitation District; 1434 Air Rail Ave., Virginia Beach, VA 23455; GWI000675

**NAME AND LOCATION OF WATER WITHDRAWAL:** SWIFT Research Center; 6909 Armstead Rd., Suffolk, VA 23435

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Hampton Roads Sanitation District has applied for a new permit for a Managed Aquifer Recharge (MAR) program. The permit would authorize the applicant to withdraw a maximum of 42,121,000 gallons per year and 7,050,000 gallons per month from the Potomac aquifer. The ground water withdrawal will support backflushing to minimize well losses and well capacity testing. The top of the Potomac aquifer at the proposed withdrawal site was determined to be 473 feet below land surface. An aquifer is a body of rock or layer of sediment in the ground in which ground water is stored and transported. DEQ has made a tentative decision to issue the permit.

**AFFECTED AREA:** Computer modeling predicts that the aquifer will not experience one foot of drawdown due to the withdrawal.

**HOW TO COMMENT AND/OR REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING:** DEQ accepts comments and requests for public hearing by hand-delivery, e-mail, or postal mail. All comments and requests must be in writing and be received by DEQ during the comment period. Submittals must include the names, mailing addresses or email addresses of the commenter/requester and of all persons represented by the commenter/requester. A request for public hearing must also include: 1) The reason why a public hearing is requested 2) A brief, informal statement regarding the nature and extent of the interest of the requester or of those represented by the requestor, including how and to what extent such interest would be directly and adversely affected by the permit. 3) Specific references, where possible, to terms and conditions of the permit with suggested revisions. A public hearing may be held, including another comment period, if public response is significant, based on individual requests for a public hearing, and there are substantial, disputed issues relevant to the permit.
