

York County's Recognizes Outstanding Youth



The Healthy Virginia Lawn program offers personalized lawn care recommendations based on your lawn's specific needs. This program begins with a site visit and soil analysis and ends with a complete management plan. When followed, these recommendations can lead to a "green" lawn – both beautiful and environmentally friendly. The fall season runs from Tuesday, August 6, to Thursday, August 22.
