

Open Burning Ban Reminders from Fire & Life Safety

Virginia's statewide burn ban begins tomorrow (2/15) and continues through April 30. The law bans open-air burning prior to 4 p.m. However, open burning is subject to additional regulations and distances, which can be found by visiting the [website](#) for more information. Residents complying with the regulations may open-air burn leaves *only* from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. and must constantly supervise the fire until it is fully extinguished. After April 30, leaf burning is permitted from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. with distance and safety precautions. Please note: Open burning is prohibited on local, state, and federal legal holidays, as well as Sundays.
