


CDR'S FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER A Public Private Partnership with Regional Impact

Impact for York County

SHORT-TERM SAVINGS

Early intervention by CDR improves outcomes and reduces the need for other services.


Nearly 50% of CDR children catch up to peers, easing Pre-K service demand.

In York County, 83 of 198 children (2023-2024) avoided special education, an enormous savings for municipalities.

Reduced child welfare costs, including tutoring, and behavioral counseling.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

The vision and purpose of CDR's Family Resource Center at 312 Waller Mill Road will benefit residents of York County in numerous ways.



LONG-TERM SAVINGS

CDR programs support local social services efforts to stabilize families.

Early intervention not only reduces special education costs but also lowers municipal expenses for crisis management and public health.

- CDR programs prevent family crisis involving young children, reducing costly emergency services like law enforcement, EMS calls, and ER visits.
- Decrease public health expenditures.
- Reduce criminal justice system expenses.

The monies municipalities spend on CDR's FRC is an investment in local economies that is **paid back** with increased tax revenue and a stable environment so that children and families can thrive and succeed.
