



## **Fiscal Year 2026 Proposed Budget in Brief Now Available Online**


York County residents are encouraged to review the budget and engage in the upcoming town hall meeting and budget public hearing to share their feedback. Key upcoming dates for public participation include:


## Route 171 Road Widening Project underway in York County

VDOT contractor crews have started widening Route 171 (Victory Boulevard) from five to six lanes between Route 17 (George Washington Memorial Highway) and Route 134 (Hampton Highway). This project aims to enhance traffic flow, reduce congestion, and increase capacity with the addition of a third eastbound lane, a second left-turn lane, and upgraded drainage and vehicle detection systems. The existing eastbound lanes will be milled and repaved, and new vehicle detection technology will be installed at intersections to improve traffic management. A new storm sewer system will also be added to enhance drainage along Route 171. The project is expected to be completed by spring 2026.
