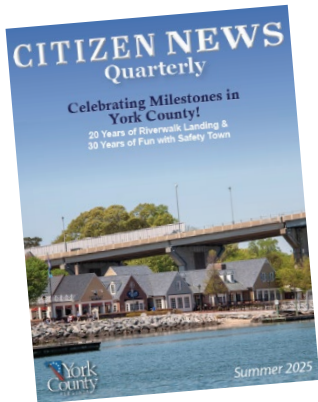

Help WATA Name its New Transfer Station

WATA is continuing to seek public input for the name of its new transfer center in the northern part of the County. The new transfer center, expected to be completed in Fall 2026, will provide amenities needed for both riders and bus operators, including indoor and outdoor waiting areas, a customer service center, bus information display screens, public restrooms, and six bus bays, allowing for future service expansion.
