Additional Notes for the Week.... This past Saturday's **Drug Take Back, Shredding Event, and Food Drive** was a tremendous success! Thanks to our community's participation, **317 pounds of food** were donated to the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank and delivered earlier this week. Additionally, **4,800 pounds of paper** were securely shredded and recycled by Shred-It, helping residents safely dispose of sensitive documents. The **York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office** also collected **173 pounds of medications** for proper disposal—preventing potential misuse and protecting our environment. We appreciate everyone who took part in this important community event! The next **National Drug Take Back Day** is expected to take place on **Saturday, April 25, 2026**.
