GIVE INPUT ON MOORETOWN ROAD (ROUTE 603) AND LIGHTFOOT ROAD (ROUTE 646) PROJECT PIPELINE STUDY IN YORK COUNTY

YORK COUNTY – The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is seeking feedback on potential concepts for a transportation study to address safety and traffic issues along the Mooretown Road (Route 603) and Lightfoot Road (Route

646) corridor between East Rochambeau Drive and north of Richmond Road (Route 60) in York County.

The goal of this study along the [Mooretown Road and Lightfoot Road corridor](#) is to develop cost-effective, preferred improvements along the corridor with a focus on improving roadway and pedestrian safety, as well as providing enhanced pedestrian, bicycle and transit access and easing congestion. This survey presents several different concepts at two intersections in the study corridor and asks participants to rate each concept.

VDOT invites residents and travelers to learn more about this study at <https://vapipeline.virginia.gov/studies/hampton-roads/hr-25-05/> and take the online survey through **Monday, Nov. 24**. A survey was previously conducted to identify needs and issues for the corridor in May 2025. Community input received through this additional survey will help the study team identify preferred concepts and determine whether to pursue future funding opportunities.



The study is being conducted as part of the [Project Pipeline](#) program, which was created by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB). Project Pipeline is a performance-based planning program to identify cost-effective solutions to multimodal transportation needs in Virginia. Project Pipeline is led by Virginia's [Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment](#) (OIP), in collaboration with VDOT and the [Department of Rail and Public Transportation](#) (DRPT).

The study is expected to be completed in summer 2026. The potential improvements established during the study are only preliminary and are not scheduled or funded as construction projects at this time. The study will recommend projects, solutions, and investment strategies that may be considered for statewide funding programs such as [SMART SCALE](#), [Revenue Sharing](#) and [Virginia Highway Safety Improvement Program \(HSIP\)](#), as well as regional and local funding sources.
