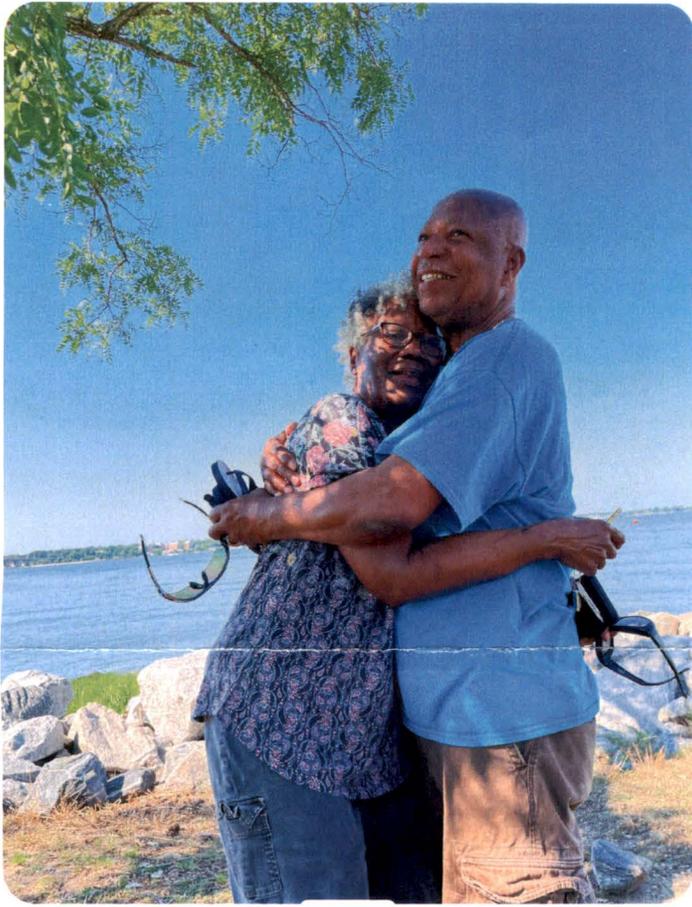

## Hospice House of Williamsburg

When Judy became ill, her husband Jasper never left her side.

“Wherever she went, I would stay in the room with her,” he said. “I just couldn’t leave.”

But when Judy came to Hospice House of Williamsburg, something changed.

“They offered me a bed,” Jasper remembered. “They told me I could stay as long as I wanted. But there was this calmness, a sweetness in the room—and for the first time, I felt okay to leave. I’d never felt that before, anywhere she’d been.”

Judy spent her final days surrounded by love. She was surrounded by her family, her church community, and by the staff and volunteers who treated her with tenderness and dignity. “Everyone seemed genuinely concerned,” Jasper said. “It was second nature to them. They gave her care that was individualized, compassionate, and real.”

Even the smallest touches mattered: a view of the playground from her room where the children she loved could play, volunteers who understood loss because they’d lived it, and a chaplain who still calls to check in on Jasper.

“I can’t quantify the feeling families get from the compassion and care here,” he said. “This place gave me peace. It gave Judy peace. You can’t put a price on that.”

Hospice House of Williamsburg is the only facility of its kind in our community—a home where families can find comfort, dignity, and support at the end of life. Every day, we welcome those who need us, whether for two days or two weeks.
