More Winter Weather Expected This Weekend

A major winter storm will impact the region starting late tonight and peaking Saturday evening through Sunday morning. **6–12 inches of snow** is expected in SE VA and NE NC, with sharp cutoffs northwest where totals may drop to 1". **Winter Storm Warnings** are in effect for SE VA/NE NC, with watches farther NW including Richmond.

Strong coastal winds may cause **blizzard conditions**, especially along the coast. **Wind chills below 0°F** are possible Saturday night into Sunday morning, with Cold Weather Advisories and Extreme Cold Watches in effect.

Tidal flooding is likely Saturday night into Sunday, with moderate to locally major flooding possible in the lower Chesapeake Bay. Coastal Flood Watches are in effect for Norfolk, Chesapeake, VA Beach, Northampton County, and Eastern Currituck County. York County's expected water level has dropped to **4.4 feet (minor)**.

Marine conditions will deteriorate, with **Storm Warnings** for coastal waters south of Cape Charles Saturday night–Sunday, and **Heavy Freezing Spray Watches** for the bay and Lower James. Small Craft Advisories remain in effect today.

York County's Leaf Collection Extended for an Additional Week (Weather Permitting)

Due to last weekend's weather conditions, the County-wide leaf collection is being extended to one week for York County, weather permitting. Residents can place an unlimited number of clear bags of leaves at the public roadside for collection during the week of February 2. Residents who live in private communities or on privately maintained roads may bring leaves to the closest public roadway for collection.

Leaves must be in clear bags, no thicker than one millimeter (no drawstrings, please!) and bags must be easy to handle by one person (max. weight limit = 40 pounds). Clear bags can be purchased at local hardware, grocery, and department stores. Bags containing other yard debris (sticks, etc.) and/or pet waste will not be accepted.

Bags must be at the front roadside by 7 a.m. on Monday, February 2. Pick up will be completed by the end of the week, weather permitting.

In addition, all residents may bring leaves year-round to the VPPSA Compost Facility located at 145 Goodwin Neck Road, Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.




