
**York County

- Value and respect the individual.





# Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> General Election



## The York County Youth Commission Encourages YOU to Vote! "VoteTeen Virginia!"

*Congratulations . . . you're finally 18, or perhaps will be by November 2. At this milestone in your life you now get an equal say in how your government works.*

*Now be sure to vote and make a difference!*

### ✓ Why should I vote?

**\*Every vote counts!** Some elections really DO come down to just a few votes. Don't underestimate the value of *yours*. Remember, you do make a difference!

**\*It's your RIGHT & PRIVILEGE!** Unlike some privileges like your car or your education, voting is your *right*. It's in the Constitution. And, defending our liberty has always come through the sacrifice and devotion of our men and women in the armed services. So, exercising our hard won freedom by voting is also our amazing *privilege* here in America!

**\*It gives YOU a voice!** Many times, teens can feel like the government doesn't represent their issues. You WILL be represented by voting.

### ✓ What do I need to do?

#### \*First, there are some rules:

- You must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of Virginia,
- You must be at least 18 years old on or before November 2, 2010,
- You must have never been adjudicated mentally incapacitated, and you must be free of felonies (or have your rights restored), and
- You must be registered to vote.

OR

**\*When can I register?** You may register as long as you will be at least 18 on or before the November General Election date (11/2/10). But there is a deadline! To vote in this year's upcoming election, **you must register by Tuesday, October 12, 2010**. If registering by mail, your application must be complete and **postmarked no later than October 12**.

**\*Where can I register?** You can register to vote in lots of places, including the York County Public Library branches in Yorktown and Tabb, the York County Registrar's Office in Yorktown, the Griffin-Yeates Center in the Bruton area, and any branch of the DMV.

OR

Download a registration form from the York County Registrar's website at [www.yorkcounty.gov/voting](http://www.yorkcounty.gov/voting) OR pick one up from the main office at Bruton, Grafton, or Tabb High Schools or from the guidance office at York High. Just complete the form and mail it in.

### ✓ What positions will I be able to vote for in this election?

**\*In the upcoming General Election, if you are a registered voter in York County in the precinct in which you live, you will be eligible to vote for the following offices and questions in the Commonwealth of Virginia:**

- Member, U.S. House of Representatives
- Three amendments to the Constitution of Virginia

**\*If you are registered to vote in a different locality, you might have other offices on the ballot.**

### ✓ So, what now?

**\*Register!** Choose a location, register, and make a difference!

**\*Get the vote out!** Tell your friends, set up a carpool to register, and go vote!

**\*Find more information!** Contact the York County Registrar's Office at 890-3440 or log onto <http://www.yorkcounty.gov/voting> for all the information you need on where, when, and how to vote.

**\*Think!** When you vote, remember that it's an important responsibility, so make your decisions well-informed ones! Check into whom and what is being voted on beforehand.
